NOVEMBER 10, 2019 THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings challenge us to focus on the "why" of stewardship. Why embrace this challenging way of life when it seems hard enough just to meet the demands of our daily lives and responsibilities? Because this life is not all there is. While we cannot earn our way into Heaven, what we do now with the life God has given us has eternal consequences. Stewardship living helps us to keep focused on our hoped-for destination in the choices we make each day.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, Christ reminds us we were made for more than just this life, and our choices have eternal consequences. In this passage our Lord corrects some Saducees for their mistaken notion that there is no resurrection. He instructs that "those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead... can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise.



Stewardship is not about the particular amount or kind of time, talent and treasure that we offer. It is about the conviction that everything we have is a gift from our loving God. Revisiting these three aspects of our lives on a regular basis, prayerfully discerning the best use of our gifts, and putting this down in writing clarifies and strengthens our conviction to put God first.

That is the "why" of stewardship.

DID YOU KNOW....

...that purgatory is a state of final purification after death and before entrance into heaven? The Catechism of the Catholic Church, article 1030 states that all who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. Purgatory is truly a place where God's infinite mercy allows us to be purified before we enter into Heaven. The late Archbishop Fulton Sheen described it in this way: "Purgatory is the place where the love of God tempers the justice of God and where the love of man tempers the injustice of man." While we don't know how long one will be in purgatory, it is not a matter of if one will go to heaven, but rather a matter of when. We can seek great comfort in this.
